## SITTINGBOURNE AND MILTON.

**KENT SPRING ASSIZES.**—The Lord Chief Justice of England (Sir A. J. E. Cockburn, Bart.) and Mr. Justice Brett will take the home circuit this spring.

**LAUNCH AT CROWN QUAY.**—On Thursday last, at high water (about two o'clock) a fine clipper-built topsail barge, the "Frank Lloyd," constructed by the Messrs. Taylor for Mr. Lloyd, was launched from their lower yard at Crown Quay. As she left the stocks she received her name at the hands of Mr. Lloyd's manager, Mr. Hudson; she entered the water in fine form, the launch being a most successful affair. Her dimensions are: Length (over all), 75ft.; beam, 17ft. 3ins.; depth of hold, 5ft. 3ins.; tonnage, about 100 tons. The "Frank Lloyd" is intended for the straw trade; she is built on very fine lines, and will, it is expected, be a very fast vessel. Should she enter for the match this year (as there is some prospect of her doing) she will no doubt give a good account of her self.
